WHERE DOES IT GO?

GARBAGE

Some examples of garbage are:

- ✓ Aluminum foil, soiled
- ✓ Broken glass (wrapped)
- ✓ Household items
- ✓ Carbon Paper
- ✓ Cloth Items
- ✓ Coffee cups, disposable
- ✓ Diapers, disposable
- ✓ Frozen juice cans
- ✓ Latex gloves
- ✓ Light bulbs
- ✓ Motor oil containers
- ✓ Packaging, non-recyclable
- ✓ Plastic wrap, soiled
- ✓ Plastics, non-recyclable
- ✓ Potato chip bags
- ✓ Styrofoam
- ✓ Toothpaste tubes
- ✓ Toys, broken

A reminder to the Urban residents that all household garbage must be **bagged, tied and in garbage cans**. **PLEASE do not put** leaves, branches, grass clippings, wood ash, plant trimmings, plant remains, **in with your regular garbage as this will not be picked up** as it goes into the compost pile.

COMPOST materials are accepted at designated areas at the waste disposal site. Compost will be available as fertilizer and can be picked up at the site at no fee.

RECYCLING

Some examples are:

- ✓ Newspapers, magazines & flyers
- ✓ Aluminum containers
- ✓ Glass containers
- ✓ Steel containers
- ✓ PET #1 Plastic Containers
- ✓ HDPE or #2 Plastic Containers
- ✓ LPDE #4 Plastic Containers & Lids
- ✓ PP or #5 Plastic Containers
- ✓ #7 Plastic Containers
- ✓ Steel containers

UNACCEPTED MATERIALS

- ✓ Aluminum foil, pie plates or food containers
- ✓ Electronics
- ✓ Paint cans or oil cans
- ✓ Window glass, mirrors or broken glass
- ✓ Wax or foil coated paper
- ✓ Dishes, ceramics or crystals
- ✓ Foam packaging of any kind
- ✓ Paper towel, tissues or napkins
- ✓ Steel pots and pans or scrap materials
- ✓ Plastic bags or cellophane

Please check with your recycling brochure for specific examples on what #1, #2, #4, #5 and #7 plastic containers are.

PLEASE do not recycle #3 OR #6 PLASTIC
#3 Plastic: Shampoo bottles, condiment bottles, teething rings,, etc. Also known as PVC
#6 Plastic: Styrofoam

HOUSE DEMOLITION REQUIREMENTS:



- ✓ Shingles must be stripped off and brought in separately and weighed at \$10.00 per tonne.
- ✓ All metal & appliances including wiring, plumbing & metal siding to be removed & brought in separately
- ✓ All vinyl siding, vinyl window, insulation, furniture, flooring that is not wood ex. Vinyl, carpets to go into trash pit
- ✓ No asbestos of any kind will be accepted at this site, contact ministry of environment on proper handling and disposal sites that handle this material
- ✓ All wood and wood products will go into the burn pit in a separate load
- ✓ Concrete to be loaded separately and weighed at landfill, \$10.00 per tonne
- ✓ One week notice required to landfill supervisor before demolition Commences.

Contractor's loads will be accepted: Tuesday and Thursday

NO LOADS ACCEPTED ON FRIDAYS, SATURDAYS OR SUNDAYS

Gilbert Plains Waste Disposal Site Waste Categories

CATEGORIES: (Each category must be kept separate)

Household waste: everyday waste created from households.

Recyclables: plastic, glass, aluminum, paper etc. will be accepted but must be separate from household waste.

Burnable: wood or cardboard only

Furniture: couches, mattress, box springs (metal frames removed)

E-Waste: computers, monitors, TV's etc will be accepted

Scrap Metal: any metal accepted

Appliances: will be accepted for metal

Propane Tanks: all sizes will be accepted, but not in steel pile and must be left with employee

Tires: all sizes accepted. An accurate count of tires required.

Batteries: All sizes accepted

Oil, paint & light bulbs: Accepted.

Concrete & Shingles: all construction material containing shingles or concrete must be accompanied with a signed and completed affidavit form. \$10.00 per tonne

ACCEPTED ITEMS:

Accessories & bags; Clothing (all types); Curtains; General Household Textiles (towels, blankets, sheets); Shoes & boots; Sleeping bags

NOT ACCEPTED ITEMS:

Household items; electronics & sports equipment; organic & hazardous material; any other textile items that do not fit inside bin
